HAPPENINGS

<u>COVID-19 Safety</u>: On June 15, 2020 the Solemnity of Corpus Christi the shrine re-opened to the public. Since that day the shrine's board of directors has instituted a number of safety precautions to limit the spread of COVID-19. First, we ask that all pilgrims visiting the shrine to kindly wear a face covering. If you cannot wear a face covering due to health reasons, we ask that you physically distance yourself from others as best as possible. Second, pews in the main worship space have been alternately closed off to prevent crowding and to promote adequate six feet social distancing. Third, mass attendance has been limited to 150 people. We kindly ask that if you want to attend a mass or special event that you pre-register either by email at info@st-annes-shrine.org or by calling the shrine office at 508-678-1510. Finally, restrooms have been marked for emergency use only. We ask that those visiting the shrine to refrain from using the restrooms unless it is an absolute emergency.

BUILDING NEWS

MAJOR REPAIRS:

We continue to work on gathering quotations to repair the roof, mortar joints on the buttresses, and for the internal restoration of the walls (plaster and painting) and murals inside the upper church.

Roof: We met with a contractor who had performed internal attic roof inspection to identify the location of the leaks, and it appears that the focus areas of repair are at the flashings located on the transept of the building as well as others areas on the perimeter. We will continue to gather quotations and then develop a firm plan for repair which would then be shared with the Diocese for review and approval.

Buttresses: The buttresses were deemed stable, but in need of having the mortar joints repointed and a quotation was gathered for that.

Upper church plaster and wall painting: We also received a quotation for restoring the damaged plaster in the upper church, and for re-painting of those areas. A quotation was also received for the restoration of the murals in the upper church that had been damaged, but are repairable.

Priority:

Our first priority for the <u>large</u> building repairs is the roof repair. We need to get that taken care of in order to allow the other repairs inside the church to move forward. We continue to work on our Capital Campaign, to fund all of the major work, but also want it known and understood by all, that all donations received thus far, and those that we continue to receive, are being saved for building operation and for building repair and that there has been no non-essential spending of funds.

Wheelchair Lift:

The wheel chair lift was recently inspected by the manufacturer's representative and was serviced. Please know that at this time, the wheel chair lift is out of service until we get it inspected by the State of Massachusetts. That will be scheduled after we complete sheet rock work in the area of the wheel chair lift, where the sump repair work was recently performed.

Santo Christo Chapel:

We are currently asking for and receiving donations for the restoration of the Santo Christo Chapel and we thank all of you who have already donated. The contents of the Chapel have been removed and the Santo Christo statue has been carefully relocated to a safe space inside our building. As with other areas of the Shrine, water infiltration at the Santo Christo Chapel has caused damage to the raised floor as well as to the walls inside the chapel.

The Chapel will be carefully studied by our Team to assess the source of the damage. We will also consult with a competent contractor as required to develop a solution and ultimately perform the necessary work. Until that time, keep the donations coming for that project. We know for certain that the entire existing raised floor structure needs to be removed and then we will assess next steps, which could include additional sump pump trenching to one of the newly installed sump pumps to perhaps filling in the below grade void with concrete. Plaster repair with this chapel will also be required along with painting. The repair for this chapel is very much a work in progress at this time.

Front Sign:

We have also met with a sign company to discuss replacing our sign located in the grassy area at the front of the church. You might notice it is leaning, and also we need to change the sign so the that it reads" St. Anne Shrine" and no longer refers to the St. Anne Parish & Shrine with associated Mass times. We are also looking at having a sign out front to communicate our upcoming events.

Front Steps:

We have also consulted with masons to discuss having the mortar joints for the front steps of the church repointed and we are looking forward to having that done in the Fall.

<u>148th Annual Solemn Novena to Good St. Anne:</u> We would like to sincerely thank all those that participated in the annual novena and feast celebrations to good Saint Anne. Although the pandemic forced us to scale back events this year, we were still able to honor our great patroness in a very holy way. A very special thanks goes to Fathers Michael Racine, Chris Peschel and Andre Patenaude for devoting time out of their busy schedules to be with us this year. We have already begun planning for next years Novena which with God's help will be bigger and better.
